CSR- STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS & GOVERNING RULES

- Governed by Section 135 and Schedule VII of the Companies Act, 2013
- Companies falling under any one of following categories are required to spend at least 2% of their average net profit for the immediately preceding three financial years on CSR activities:
 - 1) Net worth of INR 500 crore or more or
 - 2) Turnover of INR 1,000 crore or more or
 - 3) Net profit of INR 5 crore or more

CSR COUNCIL

□ Constituted on 27th June 2017 to **institutionalize the Corporate Social Responsibility** activities undertaken by the corporates in the State

FUNCTIONS:

- □ Recommend projects proposed by departments and districts to the Corporates to consider implementation
- ☐ Biannually assess the CSR activities in the State vis-à-vis the developmental agenda
- ☐ Encourage corporates to undertake baseline and impact assessment of the projects undertaken
- □ Review the information reported by Corporates regarding CSR activities and serve as feedback to corporates on the efficacy of CSR interventions.
- ☐ Assess the good practices of corporates which can be replicated in the State.
- ☐ Institutionalize Annual CSR Paper and CSR Awards

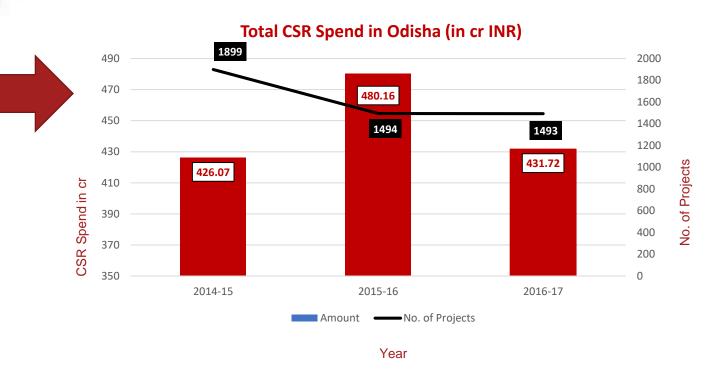

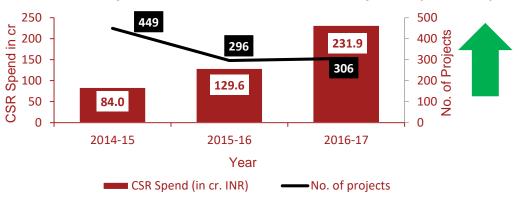
CSR SPENDING OVER THE YEARS



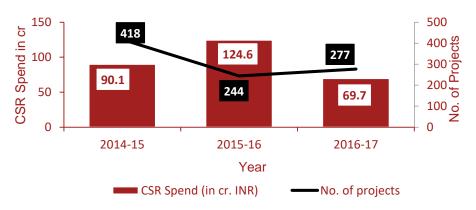

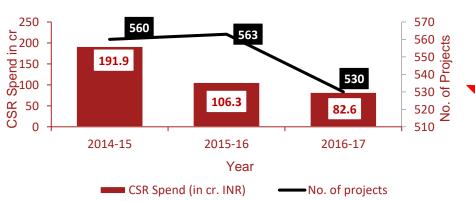




CSR Spend in Healthcare (in cr INR)

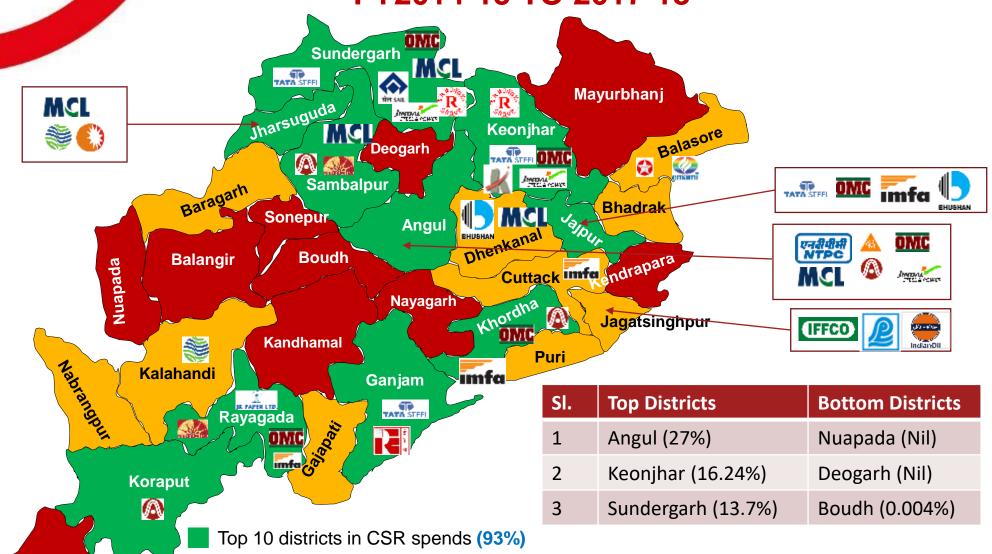

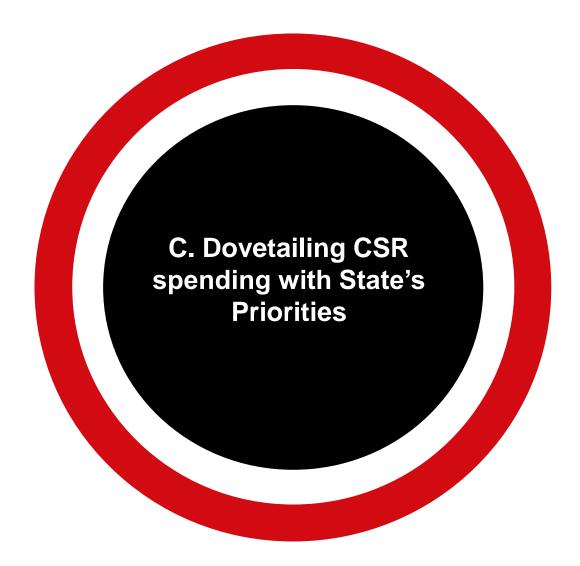

PRINCIPLES FOR RECOMMENDING PROJECTS

- Ensure more equitable distribution of CSR projects across the State and reducing disparity
- CSR Projects proposed in the "KBK+ districts" to be prioritized for their socioeconomic development
- Only projects of above certain size (which could create visible impact) to be recommended going forward.

Other Districts (19)		
Projects of value > 10 lakhs		

 Projects under Education, Healthcare and Rural Development to be given more priority considering the HDIs of the State.

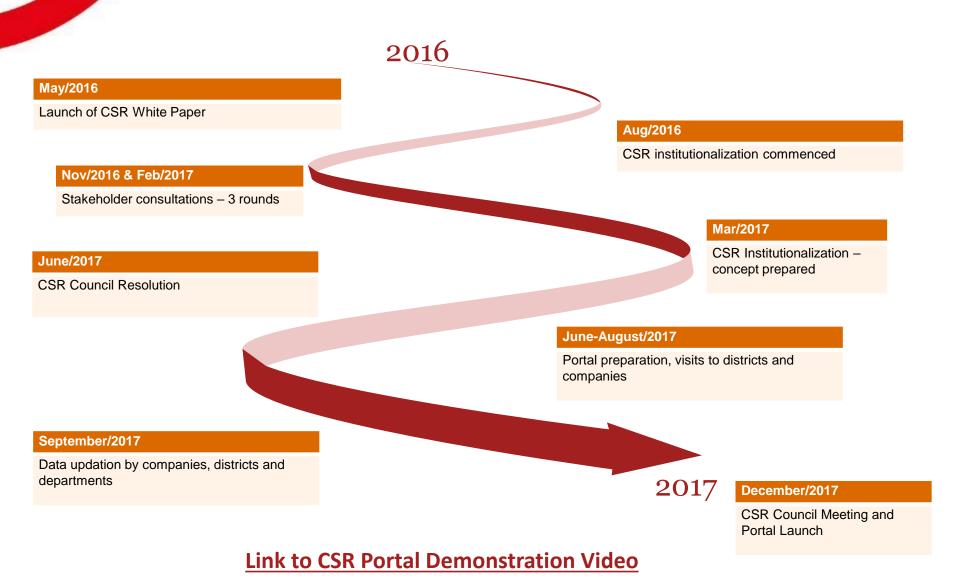
- □ Recommended projects by CSR Council to be considered by corporates during their future CSR programmes and align with the State's development goals
